Hi ,

He is the security plan with my suggested amendments which have been tracked. I have also attached the secalation plan 2016 (size A3) which accompanies the plan.

Happy to discuss any aspect of the plan and the methodology, probably the main one is that the vessel wouldn't be dealing with the at sea in the first instance. The only exists if it is stood up so best course of action for the vessel is to contact NIWA management and an emergency Response Group (ERG) is formed. The ERG then follows the process which ultimately involves the being notified.

I have put quite a few members of the ERG including T&C, reason for this is that we may be able to offer real time intelligence or quantify a situation and assist with coming to the right decision process, we have found this works when we have done exercises when a vessel is deployed. If you don't feel that the ERG needs all those people, particularly because the vessel doesn't have conference call capability then we can reduce this to a mini ERG.

I'm seeing double now with all these tracked changes so I have saved another version and accepted all the changes and will have another read through it tonight to see if it makes sense.

Other documents that I need to provide and intend to complete tomorrow are:

- Delegated authority for vessel from Master to SG's
- Security Guard orders
