

## **Drought Watch** September 2018


September to November 2018 rainfall forecast



## Regional drought potential advisory

Based on rainfall anomaly classification over the past six months and forecast rainfall anomaly classification over the next 3 months A number of island groups are at risk from high water stress over the next three months, as they have received low rainfall over the past few months and dry conditions are forecast. These include: New Caledonia, northern Vanuatu, Tokelau, the northern Cook Islands and the Marquesas.

Other countries to watch for water stress are Fiji, western Kiribati (Gilbert Islands) and central Kiribati (Phoenix Islands).



The Island Climate Update bulletin is currently being produced by NIWA in association with the Pacific Island Meteorological Services and other supporting meteorological organisations.

The Island Climate Update is prepared as soon as possible following the end of the month, once the data and information are received from the Pacific Island meteorological services.
